Laparoscopy was first reported by Kelling in Hamburg in 1901 (Kelling, 1923) when he used a Nitze (Nitze, 1893) cystoscope to visualize the abdominal cavity of a dog. Jacobeus from Sweden, who in 1910 conceived the phrase laparoscopy (Jacobeus, 1911), was credited as the first to use the technique for looking into the abdomen of humans.
